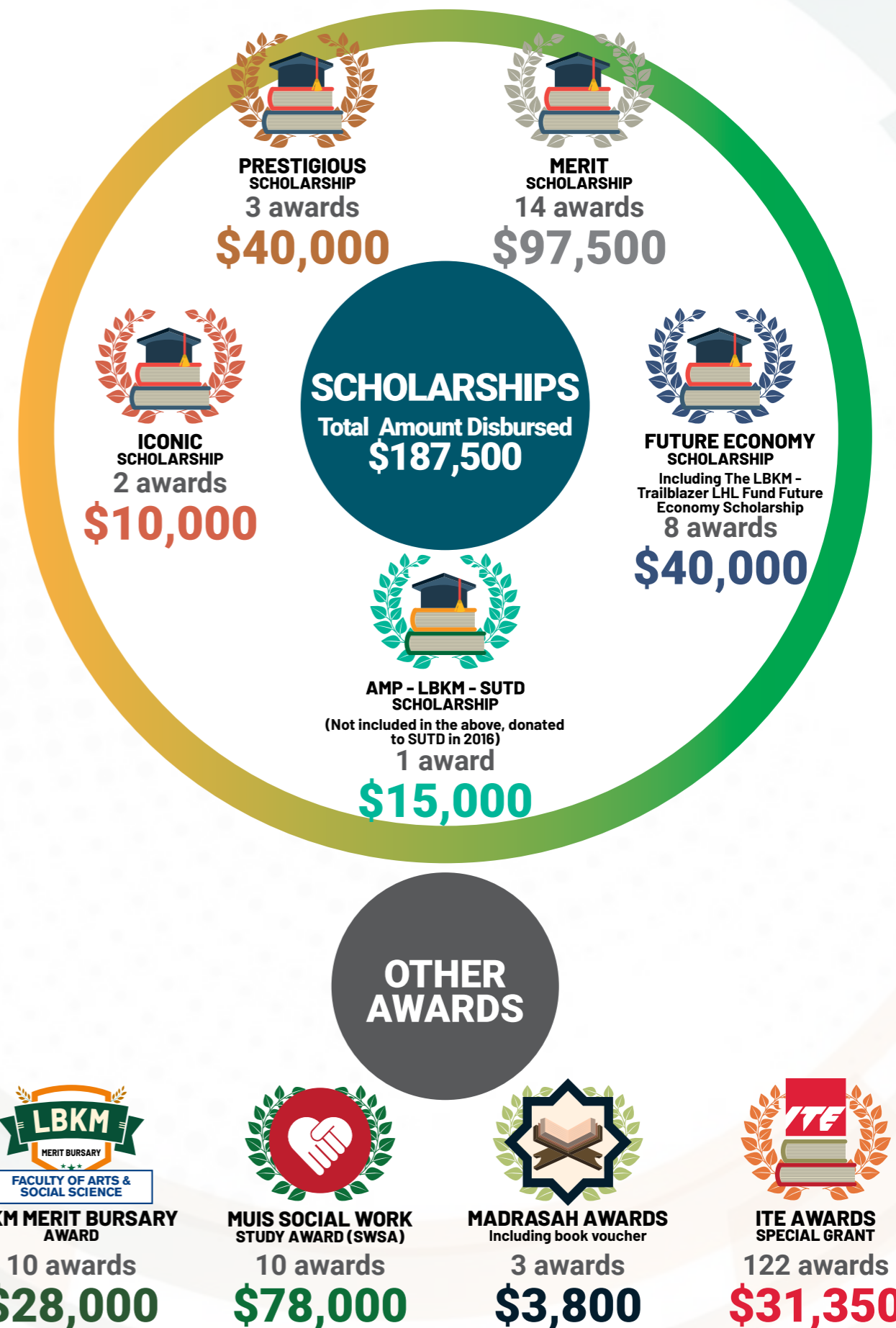

More than \$1m raised in Keppel golf fund-raiser

For the seventh year running, more than \$1 million was raised at the annual Keppel Charity Golf fund-raiser held over the weekend. Proceeds of \$1.28 million will be divided equally among 10 local charities after \$500,000 is given to the President's Challenge through Mediacorp's President's Star Charity show.

This year is the first time the event was held in support of the President's Challenge, an annual community outreach and fund-raising campaign. It is also the first time the event has collaborated with Mediacorp.

A two-team golf tournament yesterday saw Health Minister Gan Kim Yong, Labour Chief Ng Chee Meng and Minister of State for National Development and Manpower Zaqir Mohamad taking part to help raise funds.

Mediacorp artists such as married couples Fan Ling Ling and Huang Shiran, and Zheng Geqing

and Hong Huijing, and Actor Chen Timwen also participated. Over the weekend, club members took part in activities and a raffle to benefit the needy, culminating in a gala dinner last evening attended by President Halimah Yacob.

The 10 charities that will benefit are Down Syndrome Association, HCA Hospice Care, Home Nursing Foundation, Reach Community Services, Lembaga Binausaha Kewangan Melayu, Muscular Dystrophy Association (Singapore), Society for the Aged Sick, St Luke's Hospital, SPS Singapore and The Straits Times School Pocket Money Fund.

The Keppel Club, whose site in Bukit Cherrin Road will make way for the Greater Southern Water-Drain project when its lease expires in 2025, said this year's event could be one of the last few occasions that it is holding the fund-raiser.

LBKM's efforts to fulfil its mission continue to rely on the generous support of institutions, corporate organisations and individual donors. The significant fundraising events in 2019 have been held during Ramadhan, Maulid and Friday mosque collections. We foresee that these donation drives will continue except for the mosque collections, due to the strict limitations imposed by COVID-19 restrictions.

COVID-19 has directed us to review how we work and engage with our key stakeholders like our donors and recipients. For example, in the first half of 2020, we have already successfully organised 2 online bursary presentations with online chats with our recipients. These were well-received by all involved. Our online presence has been reviewed and refreshed more often as they increase in importance in the "new normal". We will continue to search for new ideas and engagement methods with our stakeholders.

To ensure that LBKM always remains relevant, we constantly need to review our products and services. This was also the subject of our most recent annual LBKM retreat in 2019. One of our new initiatives in early 2020 was to establish a COVID-19 fund to specifically meet the needs in some segments of the community which have been negatively impacted by the COVID-19 situation. In addition, initiatives started in 2019 like the School Top Up Fund will be increased and enhanced in order to reach out to more students in need.

To achieve our vision to be a distinguished bursary institution, we will constantly review our product offering and services in its totality in order to ensure that the bursaries, scholarship and financial support that we offer will meet the needs of students in this dynamic landscape. New ways to engage recipients, donors, stakeholders and new methods of raising donations and sponsorships will have to be explored as well.

No new significant expenditures are anticipated in the near future.

Governance

Role of The Board

The duty of the Executive Council is to organise and supervise the daily activities of the Society and to make decisions on matters affecting its running when the General Meeting is not sitting. It may not act contrary to the expressed wishes of the General Meeting without prior reference to it and always remains subordinate to the General Meeting.

Among the duties are:

1. Approve budget for the financial year and monitor expenditure against budget.
2. Review and approve bi-monthly financial statements
3. Regularly monitor the progress of the charity's programmes.

Term Limit of Board

All elected officers may be re-elected at alternate Annual General Meetings unless they have served for four (4) consecutive terms of 8 years bearing the same office position in the Executive Council prior to the re-election. However, the Honorary Treasurer shall not serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms of office of 4 years. The amendment to the constitution was agreed by the members in the Annual General Meeting of 26 June 2015 and approved by the Registry of Societies on 18 September 2015.

Funding Sources

LBKM is financially supported by donations and sponsorships from the public.

Reserves Policy

- 1 To maintain its reserves at a level which is at least 3 years of operating expenditure.
- 2 The Executive Council regularly review the amount of reserves that are required to ensure that the reserves are sufficient to fulfil LBKM's continuing obligations on a quarterly basis.
- 3 The reserves shall not be utilised except with the approval of the President and Honorary Treasurer or Assistant Honorary Treasurer, and only when the cashflow falls below 3 months of the monthly operating expenses.

Please refer to page 35 of the Financial Statements for the charity's reserves position.

Conflict of Interest Policy

Upon appointment or election, staff and council members are required to read the conflict of interest policy, and to sign a declaration form, to confirm that the policy has been understood, and will fully disclose to the council when an actual or potential conflict of interest situation arises. The declaration is signed annually.

At a meeting, where a conflict of interest arises, the member concerned will not vote on the matter or participate in discussions. He or she must offer to withdraw from the meeting, and the other members will decide if this is required. The basis in arriving at the final decision on the transaction or contract will be documented in the minutes of meeting.

Governance Evaluation - Annual Declaration

The twenty-one item questionnaires by the Commissioner of Charities were all answered affirmatively. The questions are on governance issues, the constitution, financial matters, responsibilities of Council members and the general administration.

Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

The SOP - containing the LBKM Constitution, financial procedures, responsibilities of volunteers and full-time staff, methods of getting contributions and sponsors, conflict of interest and publicity - is updated regularly to include the latest procedures and policies.
