Our President's Message

The last 2 years had been remarkable years for LBKM.

COVID-19 was in full swing for all of us in Singapore. We were forced out of our offices and usual comfort zones, and many of us are familiar with some form of working from home. It also brought to bear fears about our own health, concerns about when restrictions could be lifted, and what a "new normal" would be like for the community. Any previous firmly held assumptions about how the next 5 or 10 years will be or could have been, in essence, has been uprooted by the COVID-19 pandemic and may not necessarily be relevant today.

LBKM has had her challenges too. We have had to tweak many of our processes and operational activities, and the staff have had to get used to working remotely. My team and I have grown more comfortable with Zoom/Teams meetings and online bursary presentations and other events, though it never quite replaces the face-to-face interactions that we had in the past with our beneficiaries and donors. As an organisation, LBKM has learned to be agile and adaptable despite the uncertainty over the past year.

We have also drawn renewed strength from our sense of purpose in wanting to support the community's educational aspirations. No matter the external challenges, what has proven to be certain for us is that education, lifelong learning and the continued quest in knowledge remains a pillar of resilience. This is the heart of LBKM's mission and vision, and highlights the importance of LBKM's continued work for the community and its future. LBKM's staff and Council members have noted the impact of COVID-19 on the economy and finances of families, and we remain steadfast in

wanting to support any student-in-need.

LBKM continued to see an increase in the number of recipients supported. This shows that there is a demand for the bursary and scholarship support that LBKM provides, and that LBKM continues to be a valued organisation by the students and their families in the community. We anticipate that this growth will continue for LBKM, even as the government and community organisations strengthen financial support for education.

I would also like to record a special appreciation to our donors. Throughout the past 2 years, being an organisation that anchors heavily on the support of our donations, LBKM has had our moments of concern, especially as the economy took a battering, jobs were lost, and uncertainties prevailed. These were compounded further by the fact that these same conditions affected our students and their families too, and their need for financial support escalated in tandem. However, I'm heartened to see our donors rally behind this difficult period for LBKM, being more forthcoming in giving to the cause of education. This is something that LBKM appreciates deeply, and it would not have been at all possible without your support.

As the pandemic takes a turn, I am also excited by the opportunities it brings for LBKM. For sure, we will unearth new gaps in the education landscape that needs addressing and support. The cost of education, especially tertiary education, continues to rise and its impact is something we will study so that our recipients are not left behind. At the same time, the young students in our community continue to aspire far and wide in their educational pursuit, and this is something LBKM endeavours to support where we can.

LBKM has also embarked on a deliberate effort to transform how we work and serve the community. Through our digitalisation efforts, we intend to further strengthen our processes to ensure only the highest standards in governance and administration. We are also making inroads into the social media space to better engage our students and donors, so that people know better the good work that LBKM does and how we can help. Recognising that the social services space has evolved to become more interconnected and complex, LBKM is also doing its part to seek out collaborative opportunities and partnerships with the intent of strengthening our support for the students in the community.

Over the last few years, we have also developed the capabilities our younger Council members to assume key roles in the organisation. At this AGM, we will see another milestone in LBKM's leadership renewal as a new President will assume the helm of leadership. Backed with the depth of experience from the old guard and an optimism of a new team, LBKM can be assured of the continuity and strong legacy that it has built over 5 decades in helping students in need.

As I take my leave as LBKM's President at this AGM, I would like to take this opportunity to express my heartfelt thanks and gratitude to our donors, partners, volunteers and members for the support and encouragement that they have given me throughout my term in office. Also, my deep appreciation to members of the Executive Council, Board of Trustees, scholarship/award interview panels and the Secretariat for their dedication and commitment to their roles and responsibilities that not only fulfill the needs of our stakeholders, but also contribute towards enhancing the image and public profile of LBKM at the community and

national level. Importantly, all praises to Allah SWT for giving me the strength, capacity and opportunity to serve LBKM to the best of my ability.

Launch of LBKM – NUS Future Economy Scholarship Endowment Fund

LBKM Future Economy Scholarship

\$300,000 donation + \$100,000 MOE Matching Grant = \$400,000

LBKM donated a sum of SGD\$300,000 to the National University of Singapore (NUS) for the establishment of the LBKM Future Economy Scholarship at NUS School of Computing. This scholarship aims to groom talented undergraduates as captains of industry in future-ready fields such as cybersecurity, information systems and computer science while encouraging them to remain rooted in Singapore. Together with the Ministry of Education's (MOE) matching grant, the endowment fund for this scholarship amounts to a total of SGD 400,000.















12 Apr 2021: The PERGERAQ Scholarship

LBKM and PERGERAQ (Persatuan Guru-Guru Al-Qur'an) collaborated to establish an undergraduate scholarship for the study of Al-Qu'ran and Qira'at (Qur'anic Reading Methods).

PERGERAQ contributed an initial amount of \$20,000, with a quantum of \$5,000 per scholarship. The scholarship is intended specifically for tertiary Madrasah students who are looking to pursue or currently pursuing a degree in the field of Al-Qur'an and Qira'at at recognized universities.








25 Jun 2021: LBKM 40th Annual General Meeting (AGM)





The ceremony saw a total of 6 categories of scholarships and 1 award given to 29 recipients amounting to a total disbursement of \$212,500.











PUNGUTAN zakat daripada masyarakat cik Suhaimi. Islam sejauh ini menunjukkan sokongan menggalakkan, dengan Majlis Ugama Islam Singapura (Muis) dan beberapa pertubuhan Melayu/Islam menjangkakan sumbangan dijangka bertambah.

Bahkan, Muis berkata mereka menjangkakan lebih ramai anggota masyarakat memenuhi kewajipan mereka menunaikan zakat sedang umat Islam memasuki 10 malam terakhir Ramadan.

Namun, meskipun beberapa pertubuhan Melayu/Islam melaporkan kutipan yang sihat, sesetengah masih belum mencapai sasaran tetapi akan meningkatkan usaha supaya dapat membantu lebih ramai penerima

Demi memudahkan masyarakat membuat sumbangan zakat di tengah-tengah pan-demik Covid-19 ini, Muis telah memperkenalkan laman zakat baru – www.zakat.sg – tahun ini.

Ia menggalak orang ramai membuat bayaran zakat melalui laman itu menggunakan PayNow, eNets atau kad debit.

Ini untuk mengelakkan keadaan di mana terdapat ramai orang berkumpul di masjid dan demi melindungi masyarakat daripada

"Meskipun jumlah masjid yang membuka kaunter untuk mengumpul zakat terhad, lebih tiga perempat pembayar zakat kita memenuhi zakat mereka melalui laman itu dan di platform bukan kaunter yang lain, seperti cek dan stesen AXS," kata Muis.

Sebagai satu-satunya penguasa zakat di Singapura, Muis menambah ia komited memastikan semua pungutan zakat diagihkan dengan betul kepada setiap lapan asnaf mengikut syariah.

Selain Muis, masyarakat Islam di sini juga membuat sumbangan zakat menerusi badanbadan Melayu/Islam lain.

Presiden Lembaga Biasiswa Kenangan Maulud (LBKM), Encik Suhaimi Salleh, berkata mereka menyaksikan sedikit peningkatan dalam sumbangan zakat pada separuh pertama Ramadan ini, dengan badan itu sudah mengumpul sekitar \$55,000 sejauh ini.

Tahun lalu, mereka mengumpulkan \$170,000, sebahagian besarnya semasa Ra-

Tahun ini, LBKM mempunyai sekitar 500 penerima zakat, dan zakat akan diagihkan sebagai dermasiswa kepada pelajar yang memerlukan.

Dermasiswa yang akan diberikan itu berjumlah antara \$350 dengan \$2,200 bagi setiap pelajar, bergantung pada tahap pengajian mereka.

Pengasas dan Ketua Pegawai Eksekutif (CEO) Global Ehsan Relief, Encik Basheer Ahmad Ali, pula berkata sumbangan zakat oleh masyarakat kepada badan bantuan kemanusiaan itu semasa Ramadan ini menggalakkan.

Meskipun sumbangan zakat yang diterima sekitar 30 hingga 40 peratus lebih rendah berbanding tahun lalu dalam tempoh masa ini disebabkan Covid-19, sumbangan derma bagi projek Ramadan badan itu mantap. Encik Basheer berkata sekitar 70 peratus

sumbangan zakat mereka disalurkan ke luar negara, termasuk bagi pelarian Syria, Pales-tin dan Rohingya, dengan bantuan diberi dalam pelbagai bentuk seperti kewangan, bekalan makanan bulanan atau program bantuan mata pencarian.

Sekitar 30 peratus pula bagi penerima di Singapura, dengan terdapat sekitar 500 benefisiari dalam senarai mereka, seperti ibu tunggal, warga emas dan individu kurang upaya.

"Zakat adalah sistem rangkaian sosial terbina yang penting, di mana keperluan orang miskin, warga emas, ibu atau bapa tunggal dan anak-anak yatim dijaga. Ramai daripada mereka bergantung pada wang zakat untuk meneruskan kehidupan mereka," kata Encik

Persatuan Muhammadiyah pula telah mengumpulkan lebih \$100,000 dalam sumbangan zakat sejauh ini.

Namun, Setiausaha Agung persatuan itu, Cik Roszanah Abdul Salim, berkata jumlah itu lebih rendah berbanding lebih \$300,000 yang dikumpulkan tahun lalu, yang mungkin disebabkan masyarakat terjejas oleh Covid-19 dari segi pendapatan mereka semasa

LBKM bakal wujud saluran baru bagi luas jangkauan

LEMBAGA Biasiswa Kenangan Maulud (LBKM) LBKM akan mewujudkan saluran baru untuk meningkatkan jangkauannya dan perkongsian program dengan pertubu-han Melayu/Islam (MMO) yang lain, termasuk M Kuasa Tiga (M3) bagi mencapai keberkesanan dalam penyelarasan biasiswa dan penyatuan sumber.

Ini antara inisiatif baru yang akan dilak-sanakan oleh LBKM menyusuli pengumuman Menteri Bertanggungjawab bagi Ehwal Masyarakat Islam, Encik Masagos Zulkifli Masagos Mohamad, dalam Majlis Perjumpaan Hari Raya baru-baru ini.

Saluran yang dirancang akan menawarkan lebih banyak maklumat mengenai usaha pemberian biasiswa serta menyelaras pencalonan biasiswa secara langsung dan penerima biasiswa.

"Menteri dengan tepat mengingatkan ki-ta bahawa kita pasti melakukan lebih banyak hal dengan mengumpulkan sumber. Sejak beberapa tahun lalu, LKBM telah meningkatkan usaha dalam berusaha sama dengan agensi pemerintah, institusi pendidi-kan dan MMO yang berkaitan untuk memastikan bahawa sistem sokongan menyeluruh disediakan untuk bantuan pendidikan. Inisiatif seperti itu bukan sahaja akan mengurangkan kemungkinan pertindihan tetapi juga akan memaksimumkan faedah masyarakat. Among the duties are:

- 1. Approve budget for the financial year and monitor expenditure against budget.
- 2. Review and approve bi-monthly financial statements.
- 3. Regularly monitor the progress of the charity's programmes.

Term Limit of Board

All elected officers may be re-elected at alternate Annual General Meetings unless they have served for four (4) consecutive terms of 8 years bearing the same office position in the Executive Council prior to the re-election. However, the Honorary Treasurer shall not serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms of office of 4 years.

These 3 members have been crucial in providing continuity of the organisation's mission, vision and objectives. Their voluntary services are well received and appreciated, making them relevant as the pillars of the organization.

Funding Sources

LBKM is financially supported by donations and sponsorships from the public.

Reserves Policy

- 1. To maintain its reserves at a level which is at least 3 years of operating expenditure.
- 2. The Executive Council regularly review the amount of reserves that are required to ensure that the reserves are sufficient to fulfil LBKM's continuing obligations on a quarterly basis.
- 3. The reserves shall not be utilised except with the approval of the President and Honorary Treasurer or Assistant Honorary Treasurer, and only when the cashflow falls below 3 months of the monthly operating expenses.

Conflict of Interest Policy

Upon appointment or election, staff and council members are required to read the conflict of interest policy, and to sign a declaration form, to confirm that the policy has been understood, and will fully disclose to the council when an actual or potential conflict of interest situation arises. The declaration is signed annually.

At a meeting, whenever a member of the Executive Council is in any way, directly or indirectly, has an interest in a transaction or project or other matter to be discussed at a meeting, the member shall disclose the nature of his interest before the discussion on the matter begins.

Where a conflict of interest arises, the member concerned should not participate in the discussion or vote on the matter, and should also offer to withdraw from the meeting and the Executive Council shall decide if this should be accepted. The basis in arriving at the final decision on the transaction or contract will be documented in the minutes of meeting.

Governance Evaluation - Annual Declaration

The twenty-one item questionnaires by the Commissioner of Charities were all answered affirmatively. The questions are on governance issues, the constitution, financial matters, responsibilities of Council members and the general administration.

Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

The SOP - containing the LBKM Constitution, financial procedures, responsibilities of volunteers and full-time staff, methods of getting contributions and sponsors, conflict of interest and publicity - is updated regularly to include the latest procedures and policies.


