Our President's Message

LBKM Annual Bursary Presentation Ceremony

After 2 years of virtual presentation of bursaries, LBKM Annual Bursary Presentation Ceremony 2022 was held at UE Bizhub Convention Centre. Our Commitment to Excellence

Duty of The Executive Council

The duty of the Executive Council is to organise and supervise the daily activities of the Society and to make decisions on matters affecting its running when the General Meeting is not sitting. It may not act contrary to the expressed wishes of the General Meeting without prior reference to it and always remains subordinate to the General Meeting.

Among the duties of the Executive Council are:

1. Approve budget for the financial year and monitor expenditure against budget.
2. Review and approve bi-monthly financial statements.
3. Regularly monitor the progress of the charity's programmes.

Term Limit of The Executive Council

All elected officers may be re-elected at alternate Annual General Meetings unless they have served for four (4) consecutive terms of 8 years bearing the same office position in the Executive Council prior to the re-election. However, the Honorary Treasurer shall not serve for more than two (2) consecutive terms of office of 4 years.

Board members who have served more than 10 consecutive years:

1. Suhaimi Bin Salleh
He has served LBKM for 30 years now in various capacities, prominently as Honorary Treasurer and President. He relinquished his Presidency in 2022 in accordance with the term limit stated in LBKM's Constitution. He has since been invited to serve as the Immediate Past President, where his depth of experience continues to be invaluable for the next generation's leadership.

2. Halil Bin Haji Mansor
He has served LBKM for more than 20 years, from being a youth volunteer and prominently as the Honorary Secretary of the organisation. As the Honorary Secretary, he led the committee reviewing bursaries, scholarships and awards initiatives to ensure LBKM's continuing relevance to the society and community. Over the past year and this year, he has been assigned to mentor and groom the next generation of LBKM's Board members.

3. Dr Syed Harun Bin Taha Alhabsyi
He was invited to join LBKM in 2012 as an Executive Council Member. Before being elected as LBKM's 4th President in 2022, he has previously held roles as Assistant Honorary Secretary, Assistant Honorary Treasurer and Deputy President. As President, he has sought to focus LBKM on her core activities and programmes, and lent emphasis on strengthening internal governance and best practices.

These 3 members are crucial in providing continuity of the Society's mission, vision and objectives. Their voluntary services are well received and appreciated, and their continued participation in the Executive Council remains relevant at this time.

LBKM Committees

1. Finance Committee Head: Honorary Treasurer Abdullah Arief

a. Investment & Asset Management Sub-committee

Terms of reference:

- To determine LBKM's financial needs and work with the investment managers to ensure that those needs can be met by cash flows derived from operations, donations and investments.

- To determine LBKM's risk tolerance and investment time horizon in consultation with the Council and recommend investment of investible assets.
- To recommend investment policies and review existing policies and ensure that they are consistent with LBKM's investment objectives.
- To approve investment decisions up to \$100,000 per investment up to a limit of \$500,000 in total in any given year.
- To recommend investment for Council's approval above \$100,000 per investment or if the limit of \$500,000 in any given year is exceeded.
- To report on the investment performance to the Council at every Council meeting.

b. Finance Sub-committee

Terms of reference:

- To oversee the financial function, including accounting and internal controls on matters relating to finance such as procurement, quotation or tender, receipting, payment, delegation of authority and limits of approval.
- To work with the Secretariat in the preparation of the audited financial statements and to ensure that the reports are accurate and timely.
- To help develop appropriate procedures for budget preparations, review the annual budget initially prepared by the Secretariat, and ensure consistency between the budget and LBKM's plans.

- To ensure regular and accurate monitoring and accountability for funds and expenses, and report to the Council on any financial irregularities and concerns.
- To ensure proper financial governance are in place and recommend financial guidelines to the Council (such as to establish a reserve fund).
- To propose 3-5yr plan in reducing excess restricted funds.

2. Fund-raising Committee Head: Deputy President Djuanda

Terms of reference:

- To set procedures on the conduct of fund-raising activities in a manner that preserves the integrity and transparency of LBKM and promotes the public trust and confidence in LBKM.
- To identify and solicit funds from external sources and suggest new and innovative fund-raising programmes.
- To monitor fund-raising efforts to ensure that ethical practices are in place and that the public is not misled with regards to the purpose and use of the donations.
- To recommend a system for the approval of the use and application of LBKM's name and logo by third parties.
- To examine the implications on LBKM's image and reputation when entering co-ventures with other parties have been considered and how the co-ventures may be perceived by the donating public.
- To develop & execute: 1) A donor engagement plan over yearly & 3-monthly cycles, 2) A corporate engagement package & plan, 3) A bequeathing & legacy package & plan.

3. Human Resource Committee Head: Honorary Secretary Mohammad Haireez

Terms of reference:

- To oversee HR functions and policies relating to recruitment, reviewing job descriptions, performance appraisal, setting staff remuneration and annually reviewing staff salaries, bonuses and benefits package.
- To review, develop and implement HR policies.
- To oversee volunteer recruitment, incentives and management.
- To act as a grievance board for conflict resolution on formal written grievances.

4. Audit Committee Head: Council Member Rahayu

The Audit Committee facilitates the external and internal audit of LBKM. The Treasurer or the Chairman of the Finance Committee shall not concurrently chair the Audit Committee.

Terms of reference:

- To oversee the internal audit function.
- To conduct audit on a half-yearly basis on receipts and payments.
- To review external auditors' statement re audited annual financial statement.
- Where there are major audit issues, to report findings to the Council.
- To oversee the governance function
- To ensure that LBKM is in compliance with the Code of Governance for IPCs and Charities.
- To recommend steps to be taken where gaps are found.
- To draft appropriate documents for governance matters.
- To develop whistle-blowing policy
- To identify, prioritise and propose changes in key areas of LBKM's internal governance & HR processes
- To initiate & propose changes to Constitution for AGM 2023.

5. Programmes & Services Head: Council Member Ridhwan

a. Programmes Sub-Committee

Terms of reference:

- To evaluate and review current programmes and assess and ensure that their outcomes are in line with LBKM's vision, mission and objectives.
- To recommend changes to existing or introduce new programmes.
- To recommend guidelines for LBKM to provide urgent financial assistance to its beneficiaries.
- To identify gaps and whether current bursary/scholarship quantum remain relevant.

b. Media Relations / Communications Sub-Committee

Terms of reference:

- To represent LBKM in external events.
- To enhance LBKM's public image.
- To review and recommend public education strategies to serve LBKM's objectives.
- To act as resource persons and advise on public and media relations.
- To identify gaps relating to LBKM's current online/social media presence.
- To develop & execute an engagement plan over yearly & 3-monthly cycles.
- To propose areas of possible improvement (e.g. data security of applicant data, etc).

6. Appointment & Nomination Committee

Head: President
Dr Syed Harun Alhabysi

Terms of reference:

- Reviews the composition of the Council annually to ensure that the Board has an appropriate balance of independent Council members and to ensure an appropriate balance of expertise, skills, attributes and ability among Council members.
- Identifies potential Council member candidates and explores their interest and availability for service as Council member.
- Nominates individual to be elected as members of Council.
- Takes the lead in succession planning.
- Nominations Council members for elections as board officers; and
- Designs and oversees a process of board orientation.

POLICIES

Funding Sources

LBKM is financially supported by donations and sponsorships from the public.

Reserves Policy

1. To maintain its reserves at a level which is at least 2 years of operating expenditure.
2. The Executive Council regularly review the amount of reserves that are required to ensure that the reserves are sufficient to fulfil LBKM's continuing obligations on a quarterly basis.
3. The reserves shall not be utilised except with the approval of the President and Honorary Treasurer or Assistant Honorary Treasurer, and only when the cashflow falls below 3 months of the monthly operating expenses.

Charity reserves position - refer to page 33 of the Financial Statements

Conflict of Interest Policy

Upon appointment or election, staff and council members are required to read the conflict of interest policy, and to sign a declaration form, to confirm that the policy has been understood, and will fully disclose to the council when an actual or potential conflict of interest situation arises. The declaration is signed annually.

At a meeting, whenever a member of the Executive Council is in any way, directly or indirectly, has an interest in a transaction or project or other matter to be discussed at a meeting, the member shall disclose the nature of his interest before the discussion on the matter begins.

Where a conflict of interest arises, the member concerned should not participate in the discussion or vote on the matter, and should also offer to withdraw from the meeting and the Executive Council shall decide if this should be accepted. The basis in arriving at the final decision on the transaction or contract will be documented in the minutes of meeting.

Governance Evaluation - Annual Declaration

The twenty-one item questionnaires by the Commissioner of Charities were all answered affirmatively. The questions are on governance issues, the constitution, financial matters, responsibilities of Council members and the general administration.

Standard Operating Procedure (SOP)

The SOP - containing the LBKM Constitution, financial procedures, responsibilities of volunteers and full-time staff, methods of getting contributions and sponsors, conflict of interest and publicity - is updated regularly to include the latest procedures and policies.

Galak derma melalui kisah kejayaan bekas penerima biasiswa LBKM

SEJAK tahun lalu, Lembaga Biasiswa Kenangan Maulud (LBKM) telah mencuba cara baru mendekati masyarakat Melayu/Islam dalam kempen mengumpul dananya sempena Ramadan.

Ini masih mengiringi surat rayuan, tetapi kandungannya berbeza berbanding tahun-tahun sudah. Mulai tahun lalu, surat itu memaparkan bekas penerima biasiswa atau dermasiswa LBKM dan perkongsian daripada mereka tentang bagaimana perubahan itu membantu mereka mencapai impian mereka.

Surat rayuan Ramadan ini mengetengahkan kisah bekas penerima biasiswa dan bantuan kewangan LBKM antara 1966 dengan 1971. Mereka kumpulan pelajar pertama menerima bantuan daripada LBKM.

Tiga bekas penerima itu ialah perunding pengurusan di SDG International, Encik Tengku Sri Indra; pakar bedah ortopedik, Profesor Madya Aziz Nather; dan konsultan media serta ikon perenbitan televisyen Singapura, Encik Suhaimi Salleh.

Pengarah Eksekutif LBKM, Encik Muhammad Harizaini Abdul Hamid, berkata pendekatan berbeza itu bertujuan mengikut trend rayuan derma masa kini.

"Rayuan derma yang dibuat hari ini rata-rata terdiri daripada perkongsian cerita sebelum menerima rayuan. Bagi kami, apabila kami mengungkap kisah individu yang orang ramai boleh kaitkan dengan diri mereka, mereka dapat memahami kesusahan yang penerima kami lalu, dan bagaimana sumbangan kepada LBKM dan dermasiswa atau biasiswa yang LBKM agihkan kepada mereka membantu mereka dalam perjalanan pendidikan mereka," katanya.

Setiap tahun, LBKM mengagihkan hampir \$2 juta dalam bentuk biasiswa dan dermasiswa kepada lebih 1,700 penerima.

Mereka terdiri daripada pelajar peringkat sekolah rendah ke posgraduate dalam bidang ukhrawi dan duniawi.

Pucuk kepimpinan badan yang berusia 57 tahun itu kini diterajui doktor perubatan dan pakar paksiatri, Dr Syed Harun Taha Alhabsyi.

Pelantikan Dr Syed Harun, yang sebelum ini menyandang jawatan Timbalan Presiden, dibuat sewaktu mesyuarat agung tahunan (AGM) ke-41 LBKM di Holiday Inn Atrium semalam.

Dr Syed Harun, 37 tahun, merupakan presiden keempat LBKM sejak badan itu dirasmikan pada 22 Ogos 1965.

Sebelum ini, ia pernah dipimpin Haji Wan Hussin Zoolhri dan Allahyarham Syed Ali Redha Alsagoff. Dalam ucapan beliau di AGM itu, Encik Suhaimi, 67 tahun berkata:

"Mengetahui sebuah organisasi mereka tanda berusia 57 tahun bagi masyarakat Melayu/Islam merupakan satu penghormatan dan sesuatu yang sungguh istimewa.

"Saya akan mengenang masa saya sebagai presiden LBKM sebagai satu kenangan yang manis dan rasi berysyukur," katanya, yang telah memerlukan sokongan terhadap

berkhidmat dengan badan itu sejak 25 tahun lalu.

Sepanjang tempoh beliau sebagai Presiden, LBKM telah mencapai kejayaan yang ketara dalam misi mereka untuk membantu penerima bantuan dengan program dermasiswa, biasiswa dan kewangan mereka.

Di bawah kepimpinannya, program baru juga telah diperkenalkan selain menyasarkan tabir umum organisasi itu diperkukuhkan lagi.

Encik Suhaimi, yang merupakan Ketua Pegawai Eksekutif (CEO) SSA Group, turut memberikan penghargaan kepada sokongan yang diterima sepanjang menterajui LBKM, terutama para penderita.

"Sebagai sebuah organisasi yang memerlukan sokongan terhadap

Presiden baru dan pasukannya akan mempertingkatkan dan mengukuhkan lagi organisasi ini, termasuk memulakan transformasi digital yang lebih mantap untuk mempersiapkan kami menghadapi era yang dipenuhi data dan kecerdasan buatan (AI).

"Selain itu, saya berharap mereka dapat memulakan strategi dan program baru yang dapat membawa LBKM ke hadapan sepanjang tempoh 10 tahun akan datang dan seterusnya."

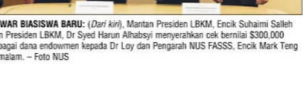
Dalam pada itu, Dr Syed Harun berkata beliau ingin memastikan badan itu dapat terus kekal relevan selain menitikberatkan isu pendidikan dan keperluan pembiayaan mereka.

Anak sulung dari kalangan empat beradik yang telah pun berumah tangga itu berkata:

"LBKM akan pereratkan kerjasama bersama badan-badan Melayu Islam demi meningkatkan lagi sokongan bagi pelajar yang memerlukan, serta bergandeng bahu untuk memberi mereka peluang secukupnya untuk mencapai kecemerlangan bagi diri mereka sendiri, keluarga dan masyarakat."

"Insyallah, pimpinan LBKM seterusnya akan membina dari kejayaan pimpinan sebelumnya, demi meraih manfaat dan sebaik-baik peluang pendidikan bagi pelajar kita, tidak kira dari aliran sekular mahupun madrasah."

LEMBAGA Biasiswa Kenangan Maulud (LBKM) semalam telah menerbitkan cek bernilai \$300,000 sebagai dana endowment kepada Fakulti Sastera dan Sains Kemasyarakatan (FASS) Universiti Nasional Singapura (NUS) untuk membiayai sebuah biasiswa baru.

Dengan derma tersebut yang turut disokong sumbangan geran yang dipadankan oleh pemerintah, LBKM menetapkan matlamat menawarkan tiga Biasiswa Sains Kemasyarakatan LBKM setiap tahun dengan setiap penerima biasiswa mendapat \$5,000.

Presiden LBKM, Dr Syed Harun Alhabsyi menyerahkan cek di blok mesyuarat Dekan, Blok AST NUS, FASS dalam satu majlis pagi semalam kepada Profesor Madya, Dr Loy Hui Chieh, Naib Dekan sekolah itu.

Dekan NUS FASS, Profesor Lionel Wee, berkata: "Biasiswa tersebut akan membekalkan kami dengan dan sokongan pelajar sains kemasyarakatan yang memajukan prestasi baik dan berminat memperkembangkan kemahiran dan mencapai potensi sepenuhnya mereka."

Bekas melarikan pengharangannya kepada LBKM atas keyakinan dan sokongan tegak perantaraan itu kepada NUS.

Sumbangan itu merupakan dana pembiayaan keempat oleh LBKM kepada universiti tempatan termasuk Universiti Teknologi dan Roka Biru Singapura (UTRS) dan Universiti Sains Kemasyarakatan Singapura (SUSS) dan yang kedua kepada NUS.

Mac tahun lalu, LBKM menerma \$300,000 kepada Sekolah Perkomputeran bagi memperluas Biasiswa Ekonomi Masa Depannya yang pertama kali diwujudkan pada 2017.

Dr Syed Harun pula berkata, biasiswa sains kemasyarakatan baru ini adalah sebagai tambahan sokongan LBKM terhadap pelajar FASS.

Sepak 2007, derma LBKM – disokong pendanaan oleh masyarakat – berjumlah lebih \$300,000 – kepada FASS ialah memberi manfaat kepada seramai 160 pelajar.

Ia telah menyokong mereka dari segi kewangan dan mengizinkan mereka mencapai kecemerlangan dalam pelajaran mereka.

"Sokongan LBKM kepada mahasiswa dalam bidang sains kemasyarakatan adalah sangat penting sedang keperluan orang ramai dan masyarakat kian bertambah rumit, sentiasa berubah dan melibatkan pendidikan."

"Saya ingin mengucapkan penghargaan kepada pelajar untuk mencapai kecemerlangan dalam bidang sains kemasyarakatan serta membina pemimpin masa depan yang bukas, tidak kira dari aliran sekular mahupun madrasah."

Biasiswa dari Harvard, LBKM sokong minat perjuang hak kanak-kanak



SIFTELAH bertahun memperjuangkan dan membela nasib kanak-kanak yang dicerca, mistikan dipinggir Singapura. Cik Ertiani Abdul Rahman, kini giat menggal faktor sosial yang menjamin kesihatan dan kebajikan kanak-kanak ini.

Malah, minatnya itu mendorongnya melanjutkan pengajian pada peringkat doktoral di Universiti Harvard, Amerika Syarikat.

Tahun lalu, Berita Harian melaporkan bahawa Cik Ertiani merupakan warga Singapura pertama menyertai program Doktoral dalam Kesihatan dan Sekolah Kesihatan Awam Harvard T.H. Chan.

Sebelum ini, beliau menerima Biasiswa Fellowship Praja daripada sekolah tersebut yang menyokong pengajiannya di bandar Boston itu.

Baru-baru ini, Cik Ertiani, 46 tahun, juga menerima Biasiswa Postdoctoral Berprestij Lembaga Biasiswa Kenangan Maulud (LBKM) bagi menyokong tabung kakap pengajiannya.

"Sudah lebih setahun menyertai program doktoral ini, Cik Ertiani berkata peluang tersebut merupakan suatu pengalaman yang hebat."

"Program doktoral dalam kesihatan awam ini berfokus dalam memberi fokus kepada kepimpinan. Setiap kohort kecil seramai 10 orang yang dipilih daripada pelbagai bidang kesihatan awam dari serata dunia."

"Antara lain, kami diajar tentang pemikiran sistem, pengurusan strategi, perakuan kewangan, epidemiologi dan biostatistik, serta cara mengumpul bukti saintifik dan memaparkannya secara berkesan. Kemahiran ini semua penting sedang kita keluar daripada pandemik," ujar Cik Ertiani yang kini masih di Boston.

"Saya ingin mengucapkan penghargaan kepada semua pihak yang menyokong saya dalam perjalanan akademik ini, terutama pihak LBKM yang telah memberi tumpuan kepada pendidikan untuk meningkatkan taraf masyarakat dan memajukan kesihatan kanak-kanak."

Pelajar tahun keempat bidang psikologi di NUS dapat suntikan semangat sebagai antara penerima biasiswa LBKM tahun ini

SEMASA membesar, Cik Tasneem Abdul Majeed telah didedahkan kepada dunia autisme mendampingi adik lakikannya menghadapi hidupnya dan tidak mampu berkata-kata.

Jadi, tidak hairanlah jika gadis berusia 22 tahun ini – yang kini memusatkan dalam tahun keempat bidang psikologi di Universiti Nasional Singapura (NUS) – berharap dapat memulakan bidang autisme untuk menyuarakan sokongan masyarakat bagi keluarga dengan anak-anak yang menghidapinya.

Cik Tasneem yang merupakan salah seorang daripada 36 penuntut yang menerima Anugerah Biasiswa LBKM tahun ini turut melahirkan harapan untuk menyuarakan insentif bagi rakan bilik diarah yang diubah etik agar dapat menyedukakan pelajar berkeperluan khas di dalam kelas alternatif biasa.

"Semasa saya membesar, saya dapat lihat cabaran yang dihadapi adik saya... dia tidak dapat berkata-kata, hanya epetit, lima perkataan yang bisa diaharkannya.

"Kini saya lihat dia semakin sensitif lantas kami sekeluarga perlu berhati-hati setiap kali kami berucap tentang dirinya," ujarnya yang mengikat banyak belajar daripada pengalaman bersama adiknya itu.

Adik lakikannya, Abdul Rauf Abdul Majeed, 19 tahun, dikesan menghidap autisme sejak berusia lima tahun dan sejak itu telah menjalani latihan di sebuah sekolah keperluan khas.

Cik Tasneem menerima Biasiswa Merit yang melaksanannya menerima \$5,000 bagi membantu beliau dalam pengajiannya.

LBKM semak dana bantu pelajar; ambil kira kos, inflasi meningkat

LEMBAGA Biasiswa Kenangan Maulud (LBKM) sedang menyemak jumlah di bawah skim bantuan kewangnya untuk pelajar memandang kos pendidikan dan inflasi yang meningkat.

Presiden LBKM, Dr Syed Harun Taha Alhabsyi, berkata badan itu sedang mengkaji langkah tersebut untuk memastikan dermasiswa dan biasiswanya kekal relevan bagi pelajar.

"Kami sedang mengkajinya kerana kos pendidikan dan inflasi telah meningkat dalam beberapa tahun lalu, dan kami ingin memastikan nilai dermasiswa dan biasiswa kami sejajar dengan perkembangan itu, dengan harapan kami dapat hulu bantuan kepada pelajar dengan berkesan," ujar Dr Syed Harun.

Beliau, yang mengambil alih jawatan Presiden LBKM daripada Enik Suhaimi Salleh pada Jun lalu, berkongsi mengenai rancangan badan amal itu dalam satu wawancara dengan *Berita Harian* (BH) baru-baru ini.

Katanya lagi, LBKM akan mengongsi butiran mengenai semakan itu apabila ia siap nanti.

Tahun lalu, LBKM membantu lebih 1,700 pelajar dengan nilai bantuan lebih \$2.03 juta. Jumlahnya meningkat dari tahun dengan sokongan masyarakat yang kukuh, kata Dr Syed Harun.

Lebih \$31 juta telah diagihkan kepada lebih 30,000 pelajar dalam tempoh lebih lima dekad sejak badan itu ditubuhkan pada 1965.

Dermasiswa LBKM kini bernilai \$300 bagi pelajar menengah dan mencapai \$2,800 bagi pelajar Falsafah Kedoktoran di luar negara.

Biasiswanya pula bernilai \$5,000 di peringkat mahasiswa dan mencecah \$15,000 bagi pesiswazah.

LBKM juga sedang melihat apakah bantuan yang boleh diperkukuh lagi, mengambil kira trend seperti pembelajaran di rumah.

Presiden LBKM pakar psikiatri di sektor swasta

SATU-SATUNYA pakar psikiatri Melayu/Islam di Singapura, Dr Syed Harun Taha Alhabsyi, telah meninggalkan sektor awam dan menyertai sektor swasta sebagai konsultant.

Dr Syed Harun, 37 tahun, sebelum ini berkecimpung lebih sedekal dalam sektor awam, dan merupakan mantan Konsultant Pakar Psikiatri di Angkatan Bersenjata Singapura (SAF), dan mantan Konsultant Pelawat di Institut Kesihatan Mental (IMH).

Sejak 1 Oktober lalu, beliau menyertai Klinik Perubatan Psikologi Better Life – yang terletak di Pusat Perubatan Novena – sebagai Konsultant Pakar Psikiatri.

"Ada doktor yang mungkin kekal dalam perkhidmatan awam sepanjang hidup mereka, dan ada juga yang beralih ke sektor privat.

"Ia hanya satu peralihan. Kerja klinik yang kami lakukan tetap sama, cuma dalam sektor privat pesakit mungkin lebih mudah berjumpa dengan kami. Terdapat lebih banyak fleksibiliti dalam sektor privat," ujar Dr Syed Harun apabila ditemui di kliniknya baru-baru ini.

Perubahan dalam kerjayanya itu juga berlaku sekitar empat bulan selepas beliau mengambil alih jawatan Presiden Lembaga Biasiswa Kenangan Maulud (LBKM) daripada Enik Suhaimi Salleh pada Jun lalu.

"Apabila peluang menyertai sektor swasta ini datang pada masa yang sama dengan perubahan di LBKM, saya hanya iktiharah dan semua nampaknya berjalan lancar.

"Saya hanya perlu bertindak dengan yakin. Tak ada kepastian apabila anda masuk ke sektor swasta. Anda masih perlu mantapkan kedudukan anda," ujar Dr Syed Harun, yang sudah berumah tangga dan belum dikurniakan anak.

Selain penglibatannya dalam LBKM, Dr Syed Harun juga aktif dalam kerja masyarakat sebagai anggota Majlis Tertinggi Majlis Agama Islam Singapura (Muis); Naib Pengerusi Panel Perundingan Filem

di bawah Penguasa Pembangunan Infokom Media (IMDA); dan Anggota Jawatankuasa Semakan (Rumah Orang Melarat) di bawah Kementerian Pembangunan Sosial dan Keluarga (MSP).

Beliau juga anggota Majlis Belia Kebangsaan dan Setiausaha Persatuan Psikiatri Singapura.

"Seperti dalam tugas saya sebelum ini, saya berasa beruntung mempunyai bos yang memahami kerja masyarakat saya, dan menyokong saya selama ini.

"Saya melihat penglibatan saya dalam masyarakat ini sebagai satu lanjutan kepada kegiatan kokurikulum (CCA) semasa di sekolah dahulu.

"Anda mahu menyumbang kepada masyarakat tetapi penglibatan itu sebenarnya juga menyumbang kepada pembangunan peribadi dan harap-harap, kematangan anda juga," ujarnya, yang pernah menjadi Presiden Persatuan Islam Universiti Nasional Singapura (NUSMS).

Sebagai satu-satunya pakar psikiatri Melayu/Islam di Singapura, Dr Syed Harun juga berkata terdapat skop baginya untuk memupuk kesedaran mengenai kesihatan mental, serta isu kesihatan lain.

Dr Syed Harun yang juga seorang pakar psikiatri, mula terlibat dalam LBKM pada 2012 apabila beliau mula bertapak dalam kerjayanya sebagai seorang doktor perubatan.

Sedang beliau tidak pernah menerima biasiswa LBKM sebelum ini, misi LBKM dalam pendidikan merupakan sesuatu yang dekat di hatinya.

"Kehidupan berubah menerusi pendidikan, sama ada menerusi dermasiswa atau biasiswa.

"Apabila saya di universiti, saya juga mengajar tuisyen untuk membantu membayar yuran sekolah perubatan.

"Mendengar kisah pelajar yang dibantu LBKM, mereka berkata biasiswa banyak membantu dan mereka boleh memberi tumpuan kepada pelajaran dan mencapai prestasi baik.

"Kesan daripada bantuan seperti ini akan untuk dinilai. Inilah yang mendorong saya untuk melakukan lebih untuk membantu mereka," ujar Dr Syed Harun.

TUMPUAN PENDIDIKAN KEKAL RELEVAN

Katanya lagi, LBKM telah mampu untuk kekal relevan sejak hampir enam dekad sehingga kini kerana perjumpaan kepada mauludkan endowment sendiri, tetapi ini merupakan sesuatu peluang yang sedang ditoreka badan tersebut, ujar Dr Syed Harun.

Malah, badan itu juga mendapat pertolongan daripada pihak yang bukan sahaja mahu menderma, bahkan mahu membubuhkan endowment untuk memberi sumbangan yang lebih besar dan berkesan berterusan.

LBKM masih 'muda' lagi dalam perjalanan untuk menubuhkan endowment sendiri, tetapi ini merupakan sesuatu peluang yang sedang ditoreka badan tersebut, ujar Dr Syed Harun.

"Dermasiswa tetap penting. Kita masih ada pelajar yang memerlukan.

"Biasiswa yang ditawarkan kini adalah berkenaan dengan usaha pelajar untuk mencapai kecemerlangan," ujar Dr Syed Harun.

SOKONGAN KUKUH

LBKM juga mampu terus memberi bantuan kewangan kepada pelajar dengan sokongan kukuh dan derma daripada masyarakat, termasuk mereka yang pernah dibantu LBKM dan kini mahu menyumbang kembali, kata Dr Syed Harun.

"Untuk menjadi yayasan, bukan sesuatu yang mustahil tetapi kami harus melihat apakah bentuk yang terbaik bagi LBKM.

"Kami berada dalam keadaan kukuh hari ini tetapi saya juga praktikal. Pada masa yang sama, tak salah kita untuk kita mengimpikannya.

"Bayangkan jika LBKM dapat meraih sokongan masyarakat untuk capai ke tahap itu, banyak yang boleh dilakukan untuk membantu pelajar kita," ujarnya.

"Kehidupan berubah menerusi pendidikan, sama ada menerusi dermasiswa atau biasiswa. Apabila saya di universiti, saya juga mengajar tuisyen untuk membantu membayar yuran sekolah perubatan.

Mendengar kisah pelajar yang dibantu LBKM, mereka berkata biasiswa banyak membantu dan mereka boleh memberi tumpuan kepada pelajaran, dan mencapai prestasi baik.

Kesan daripada bantuan seperti ini sukar untuk dinilai. Inilah yang mendorong saya untuk melakukan lebih untuk membantu mereka."
